News from the Silver Bug:

Did you know that the US has only one official investment-grade silver coin? That coin is the American Silver Eagle bullion coin, minted since 1986 and is 99.9% fine silver content and has a weight of one troy ounce / 31.34 grams. The Silver Eagle continues to this day to be the most popular silver bullion coin purchased by investors around the world with sales in excess of 400 million coins. In 2015 the sales were as follows: Bullion coins 47 million (investor grade), Proof 707,518 (collector grade). The last production figure that was made available from the Money Metals Exchange in 2017 was 18,065,500 silver eagles.

By the way, the weight and purity of each Silver Eagle is guaranteed by the US government.

Silver American Eagles come in bullion and proof forms. Bullion struck coins are produced in much larger quantities and are more suitable for investment purposes because of their lower purchase price, this is due to the fact that they are struck only once in the minting press and do not have the mirror finish and or mint mark that is prevalent with the proof variety.

Proof Silver Eagles are produced in limited quantities and demand a higher premium because they must be struck twice or more and require specially made and polished dies. Each coin has a mint mark designating at which mint the coin was produced. There are three different mint marks used in the production of these coins, they are as follows: S - denoting that the coin was produced at the San Francisco mint in the period of 1986 - 1992. P - denotes that the coin was produced at the Philadelphia mint in the period of 1993 - 2000. W - for West Point, New York. These coins were struck in the period 2001 to present day. The mint marks are found on the reverse side of these coins.
